CERTIFICATES OF APPRECIATION 2002

Recommendation

Heritage Vaughan recommends:

That the following individuals and organizations receive a year 2002 Certificates of Appreciation award:

1. The Kleinburg and Nashville Old Boys Association for efforts in the identification and preservation of artifacts that document the history of Kleinburg.
2. Ms. Pat Ash for the donation of early photographic records representing the earliest photographic processes in the City of Vaughan Archives.
3. The Vaughan Township Historical Society for its continued efforts to support the Cultural work of the City Archives through the development of a post card collection that documents various aspects of life in Vaughan's past.
4. The Thornhill Women's Institute for the donation of the final installment of the Institute's organizational records including the celebrated Thornhill Tweedsmuir History.
5. Mrs. Janet Berton for the donation of records of "Windrush Properties" which provides evidence of early development activities in Vaughan.
6. Mr. Michael Burgess for the donation of records of the "Maple Knit-Wit Club", a local women's organization established to produce knit wear and raise money for the Canadian War effort during WWII.
7. Ms. Jesse Mackenzie Glynn for the donation of additional documentary material and artifacts of one of the City's most significant cultural collections: the Major "Lex" Mackenzie Fonds.
8. Dr. Peter Morse for the authentic "heritage" design of his residence in Thornhill.
9. Ms. Marjorie Reaman Shields for the preservation of the Reaman House in a new Thornhill subdivision.
10. Mr. Iain Craig for the tours and endeavours in promoting the Humber River.
11. Church officials of the Humber Summit Church (Islington and Steeles) for the relocation and preservation of the church building in light of the Islington Avenue road expansion and realignment.
12. Mr. John Di Poce and Mr. Tony Varone, principal owners of Rosemar Ranch Holding Limited, developers of 10480 Islington Avenue, Kleinburg, for the appropriate architectural design of their development in the Kleinburg historic core.
13. Mr. Bruce Thom and Mr. Scott Rutledge principal owners of Rutledge Development Corporation for the "heritage" design of their development (the dental office) at the southeast corner of Jane Street and Major Mackenzie Drive.

In 1989, Council adopted a program to grant awards to individuals and organizations that have made an outstanding contribution to the preservation of heritage/cultural resources in the City of Vaughan.
