#### **Purpose**

To declare the International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination in the City of Vaughan and to hold a public celebration of the membership of the City of Vaughan as a member of the Coalition of Municipalities Against Racial Discrimination and Discrimination

#### **Background - Analysis and Options**

In the latter part of 2006, the City of Vaughan approved joining the Coalition of Municipalities Against Racism and Discrimination. Although there was consideration, up until this time, the City has not held a public celebration of the approval. The International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination provides a perfect opportunity to both recognize a very important historical event and confirm the City's commitment to the Coalition and its efforts. The International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination of Racial Discrimination is observed annually on 21 March. On that day, in 1960, police opened fire and killed 69 people at a peaceful demonstration in Sharpeville, South Africa, against the apartheid "pass laws". Proclaiming the Day in 1966, the General Assembly called on the international community to redouble its efforts to eliminate all forms of racial discrimination
