OPA 604 OAK RIDGES MORAINE CONFORMITY OFFICIAL PLAN AMENDMENT PROPOSED PROVINCIAL MODIFICATIONS

(Referred from the Council meeting of April 26, 2004)

Council, at its meeting of April 26, 2004, adopted the following:

- 1) That this matter be referred to the Committee of the Whole meeting of May 3, 2004; and
- 2) That the deputation of Mr. Paul De Buono, Vaughan Watch, P.O. Box 5126, Vaughan, L6A 1R6, be received.

Report of the Commissioner of Planning, dated April 19, 2004

Recommendation

The Commissioner of Planning recommends:

- 1. THAT the Minister of Municipal Affairs BE ADVISED that the City of Vaughan endorses the proposed modifications to OPA 604, with additional wording as detailed in this report and with the following additional modification:
 - a) deletion of the Wellhead Protection Policies of the *Oak Ridges Moraine Conservation Plan* as detailed in this report.
- 2. THAT this report be forwarded to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs as the City's request that OPA 604 be finally approved by the Ministry in a timely manner.

Purpose

The purpose of this report is to set out the Minister of Municipal Affairs proposed modifications to OPA 604 (Oak Ridges Moraine Conformity Official Plan Amendment) and to report back to the Ministry, Council's position on the modifications.

Background - Analysis and Options

On June 23, 2003, Council adopted OPA 604, the City's Oak Ridges Moraine Conformity Official Plan Amendment. The Oak Ridges Moraine Conservation Act requires that all local municipalities with lands on the Oak Ridges Moraine, amend their official plan to be in conformity with the Oak Ridges Moraine Conservation Plan, Ontario Regulation 140/02 by October 2003. Regional municipalities with lands on the Oak Ridges Moraine were also required to amend their Official Plans by April 2003. The Region of York's OPA 41 is in the process of receiving final approval, as modified by the Minister.

Wellhead Protection Area Policies and Mapping

On May 12, 2003, Council passed a resolution requesting a 1-year extension to finalize the portions of the Oak Ridges Moraine conformity OPA related to the Wellhead Protection Area policies and mapping. In the interim, York Region has been working on mapping the Regional wellhead protection areas, which would be impacted by the *Oak Ridges Moraine Conservation Act and Plan*. It demonstrates that there are no wellhead protection areas in Vaughan which are impacted by this legislation.

There is one municipal well on the Oak Ridges Moraine in Vaughan, located on the Maple Nature Reserve Lands, owned by the City, which supplies irrigation water to Eagle's Nest Golf Course.

However, this well does not supply potable water and there is a water line along Dufferin Street which supplies potable water to the adjacent lands in this area. As such, it is not necessary to include this well in a wellhead protection area.

Therefore, it is appropriate to delete the draft wellhead protection area policies which were included in Section 5.16 of OPA 332 and Section 10.18 of OPA 600. These modifications can be made by the Minister at the time of approval.

Proposed Modifications

The Minister's proposed modifications to OPA 604, amending OPA'S 332, 350 and 600, are detailed in Table 1 below. The modifications include some administrative adjustments, and clarification of Provincial implementation of the *Oak Ridges Moraine Conservation Act* in the area of transition provisions. The modifications not listed in the chart below are primarily administrative. All modifications have been incorporated into a consolidated version of OPA 604 (Attachment #1). There are no proposed mapping modifications to OPA 604.

The following modification was proposed to be included in the implementation sections of 332, 350, and 600:

"For the lands on the Oak Ridges Moraine, the City shall undertake, in partnership with the Province, the Region, and other stakeholders:

- a) The development and administration of effective and accessible data management systems for natural heritage and hydrological information; and
- b) The development of programs to monitor the long-term health of the Oak Ridges Moraine and assist in public education. "

The proposed policy appears to bind the municipality to participating in an initiative without consideration of the costs or responsibilities associated with its implementation. Clarification was obtained from Municipal Affairs staff as to the nature and intent of the policies. Ministry staff clarified that the proposed modification under part a) above would establish a process for the transfer of information from Vaughan to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs, on amendments to Natural Heritage and hydrological information and not require Vaughan to administer or maintain a data management system for natural heritage and hydrological information. The proposed modification under part b) for the monitoring and education programs is proposed for future Provincial initiatives which have yet not been developed. The inclusion of part b) is not considered appropriate at this time until the monitoring and education programs have been developed by the Province.

As such, Staff propose the deletion of part b) and the addition of the following wording to the policy in part a) to clarify the meaning of the proposed modification. The revised policy would be as follows:

"For the lands on the Oak Ridges Moraine, the City shall undertake, in partnership with the Province, the Region, and other stakeholders:

- a) The development and administration of effective and accessible data management systems for natural heritage and hydrological information by the City circulating approved Natural Heritage and Hydrological Evaluations reflecting amendments to natural heritage and hydrological data to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs.
- b) The development of programs to monitor the long-term health of the Oak Ridges Moraine and assist in public education. "

Relationship to Vaughan Vision 2007

Vaughan's commitment to protecting the Oak Ridges Moraine through the implementation of the Oak Ridges Moraine Conservation Act and the Oak Ridges Moraine Conservation Plan, is consistent with the priorities established in Vaughan Vision 2007 in Section 4.4 Ensuring Citywide protection of the environment, Section 4.6.2 Encouraging the preservation of significant natural areas, and Section 5.3.1 Coordinating strategies and priorities with the Region of York and other levels of government.

Conclusion

The Minister of Municipal Affairs is in the final stages of approving OPA 604, Vaughan's Oak Ridges Moraine Conformity Official Plan Amendment, once the City's response to the proposed

modifications to OPA 604 is received. The next stage to final completion of the conformity process is the Minister's consideration of By-law 242-2003. Should Committee concur with this report, the recommendations in this report can be adopted.
