ALL-WAY STOP CONTROLS DAVOS ROAD AND FOSSIL HILL ROAD, AND MARIA ANTONIA ROAD AND FOSSIL HILL ROAD

Recommendation

In response to requests from the Vellore Village Residents' Association, Local and Regional Councillor Linda D. Jackson recommends:

THAT staff be requested to investigate the need for and feasibility of installing an all-way stop control at Maria Antonia Road and Fossil Hill Road and to report to the Committee of the Whole meeting of October 4, 2004, and

THAT staff be directed to investigate the need for and feasibility of installing an all-way stop control at Davos Road and Fossil Hill Road and to report to the Committee of the Whole meeting of October 4, 2004.

Purpose

To reduce speeds and control traffic at the intersections of Davos Road/Fossil Hill Road and at Maria Antonia Road/Fossil Hill Road.

Background - Analysis and Options

Motorists are confused by the existing two-way stop controls at both these intersections, which cause them to enter the intersection prematurely, believing the oncoming traffic also has a stop control.

Davos Road has recently been opened to through traffic at Weston Road, resulting in increased traffic volumes along Davos Road. Davos Road is the main route used by students attending Fossil Hill Public School from the northern part of the subdivision.

Vehicles routinely speed along both stretches of road and the area residents perceive a need for speed and safety controls. All-way stop controls will encourage increased moderation in vehicular speeds.

Relationship to Vaughan Vision 2007

This report is consistent with the priorities previously set by Council.

Conclusion

In response to concerns from the Vellore Village Residents' Association, it is recommended that staff review the need for all-way stop controls at Maria Antonia Road/Fossil Hill Road and at Davos Road/Fossil Hill Road.
