Dear Mayor Jackson:

Last year, the Minister of Health, the Honourable George Smitherman declared September 13-17, 2007 Childhood Cancer Awareness Week. The week long campaign was a tremendous success with 4 full page supplements in the National Post, mayoral proclamations and/or best wishes across the province, more than 6000 gold awareness ribbons distributed to Ontarians, and many more successful local events designed to raise awareness around the issues associated with a childhood cancer diagnosis.

This year, Health Minister George Smitherman will proclaim September as <a href="Childhood Cancer Awareness Month">Childhood Cancer Awareness Month</a> in Ontario. We respectfully request that you join the provincial government, and other mayors across the province, in showing your support for this initiative by preparing an official proclamation declaring <a href="Childhood Cancer Awareness Day in the Town of Vaughan">Childhood Cancer Awareness Day in the Town of Vaughan</a>. POGO and its partners are trying to coordinate one or two days during the month of September to hold press conferences and receptions across the province so that mayors and other government delegates may attend and read the proclamations/well wishes to media and leaders in our community.

Plans for POGO's Childhood Cancer Awareness Month include: a formal Mayoral ceremony, a gold ribbon distribution campaign, and a grassroots student initiative where schools across the province use chalk in their school yards to communicate get well messages to their peers struggling with a cancer diagnosis.

This year, POGO's partners National Post, Global Television and news anchor Anne-Marie Mediwake will take a lead role in creating a significant media event to celebrate POGO's (and its partners') achievements in pediatric oncology during the last 25 years.

POGO is the official advisor on childhood cancer to the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care. Given that cancer is the biggest disease killer of children in Ontario (two children die of cancer every week in this province), it is imperative to raise public awareness about the disease and its effects. In Ontario alone, over 400 children are diagnosed with cancer every year, and at any point in time over 3,000 of this province's children require cancer care. Although cure rates in childhood cancer are greater than 75%, approximately 50% of these survivors in turn face late effects (including neurocognitive impairments, sterility, and secondary cancers) as a result of
