

COUNCIL **JUNE 23, 2003**

RETAIL BUSINESS HOLIDAY ACT EXEMPTIONS

Recommendation

The City Clerk, in consultation with the City Manager and the Director of Legal Services recommends that in order to assist businesses in the City of Vaughan from the negative impact of the SARS outbreak, Council adopt the following resolution:

- 1) That the Region of York be requested to exempt all retail businesses in the City of Vaughan from the provisions of the Retail Business Holidays Act, pursuant to Regulation 711/01, for every statutory holiday after Canada Day, up to and including Thanksgiving 2003, for the purposes of permitting fairs, festivals or other special events; and
- 2) That staff be authorized to submit to the Region of York any applications that may be necessary.

Purpose

The purpose of this report is to advise Council of correspondence received from the Regional Clerk regarding possible applications for exemptions from the Retail Business Holiday Act to address the loss of business revenues across York Region resulting from the SARS outbreak.

Background - Analysis and Options

The Council of the Regional Municipality of York will be holding a public meeting on the 17th of July 2003 to consider exceptions to the Retail Business Holiday Act (Attachment #1). In this regard, correspondence has been received from the Region (Attachment #2). In addition, the Town of Markham's Finance and Administration Committee recently passed a resolution that would request the Region to exempt businesses in Markham and across all of York Region from the Retail Business Holiday Act for the remaining holidays in 2003.

Conclusion

It would be appropriate for Council to consider passing a resolution requesting that the Region exempt businesses in the City of Vaughan from holiday closures for the balance of 2003.

The City Clerk, in consultation with the City Manager and the Director of Legal Services recommends that in order to avoid a ban on business in the City of Vaughan from the regular impact of the SARTS numbers, Council adopt the following resolution:

- 1) That the Region of York be requested to exempt all retail businesses in the City of Vaughan from the provisions of the Retail Business Holidays Act, pursuant to Regulation 111/04 for every statutory holiday after October One, 2003, including Thanksgiving, 2003, for the purpose of permitting RPA tax rolls or other special events; and
- 2) That staff be authorized to submit to the Region of York any applications that may be necessary.

Purposing

The purpose of this report is to advise Council of correspondence received from the Region of York regarding possible applications for exemptions from the Retail Business Holidays Act to without the loss of business revenues across York Region resulting from the SARTS numbers.

Background, Analysis and Options

The Council of the Regional Municipality of York held a public meeting on the 17th of July, 2003 to consider exceptions to the Retail Business Holidays Act (RBA) (item #1). In the report, correspondence has been reported from the Region (Attachment #2). In addition, the Town of Markham's Finance and Administration Committee recently passed a resolution that would request the Region to exempt businesses in Markham and across all of York Region from the Retail Business Holiday Act for the remaining holidays in 2003.

Conclusion

It would be appropriate for Council to consider passing a resolution requesting that the Region exempt businesses in the City of Vaughan from holiday closures for the balance of 2003.



Re: Retail Business Holiday Act Exemptions

At its meeting of June 12, 2003, Regional Council passed a motion that shall be submitted to take the necessary actions to commence the process set out in the *Retail Business Holidays Act*, including giving notice of a special meeting of Council on July, 2003 if necessary, so that Council can consider Region wide exemptions to the holiday provisions in the Act for the remainder of 2003 at the earliest possible time. The motion was passed in connection with consideration of Region-wide initiatives to address the loss of business revenues resulting from the SARS outbreak.

Dates have been established that Regional Council will hold a special meeting on July 14, 2003, at 9:30 a.m. The attached notice to this effect has been published this week in the local newspaper. The only "holidays" remaining in 2003, as per the Act, would be Labour Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.

The *Retail Business Holidays Act* provides that Council shall consider a by-law permitting certain business establishment in the municipality to remain open on holidays for the maintenance or development of business only as an application. It also specifies that a local municipality can make an application. Each local municipality would need to make an application to establish retail business as attachments in that municipality.

Section 4(2) of the Act provides that Regional Council may only pass an exemption by-law if there is compliance with the minimum criteria set out in the regulation.

I am enclosing a copy of Regulation 711/93 setting out the minimum criteria. Section 5 of Regulation 711/93 provides that despite any other provision in the Regulation, retail businesses established in a municipality may be exempted for up to five days & nights during which a fair, festival or other special event is being held in that municipality. The application should indicate the fair, fest or special event.

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We also refer you to Section 6 setting out the requirements of the application.

Given the timeliness of your Council wishes to make such an application, it would be appreciated if we could receive this application, with the specification of the retail business establishment, reasons or other criteria, holidays and times on those holidays, at the earliest possible date prior to the July 17, 2003 public meeting. Please note that it would only be necessary to make the application to your Council, whether that there be a change in the current exemptions applying to your municipality.

*This act is made pursuant to section 7(1) of the Ontario Business Corporations Act, 2009, by virtue of which this document is to be made public in accordance with section 14 of the Ontario Business Corporations Act, 2009.

service Table of Regulations (Legislative History)

This Regulation is made in English only.

1. This regulation sets out the criteria that must be met before a municipality may issue an exception to the under subsection 4(1) of the Act O. Reg. 71/99, s. .

2. (1) A local business establishment may be exempted if

- (a) it is located within two kilometers of a municipal library; and
- (b) it is directly associated with the local municipal or federal authority visiting the exemption for business on a holiday;

(2) An exemption granted on an annual basis may only be granted if

- (a) all of the retail business establishments in the same area within two kilometers of the local authority;
- (b) the zone does not exceed the proximity of exemptions in the retail business circumstances for which an exemption is sought; and
- (c) at least 75 per cent of the retail business establishments in the area are directly associated with the retail structure or other retail business visiting the area on the business or a holiday.

4.b

(3) To the purposes of this section, a **holiday** is limited to,

(a) **national** ~~and~~ **provincial** or outdoor **recreational** **vacations**;

(b) **religious** **vacations**; and

(c) cultural, **music**, educational **activities**. Q. Reg. 71/04, s. 2.

3. Each retail establishment that **conducts** **more** **than** **100** **days** **annually** uses a total area of 2,000 square feet or more for serving the public or **directly** **for** **more** **than** **four** **hours** **or** **more** **employees** **serving** the **public** **each** **day**, in addition to meeting the **vacation** **or** **vacations** **as** **described** **in** **section** **2** **(1)**, provide goods or services on holidays permanently or temporarily. Q. Reg. 71/04, s. 3.

4. The two **establishments** **set** **out** **in** **subsection** **2** **(1)** and **(2)** does not apply to a **retail** **travel** **club** **establishment** located in a **local** **municipality**, **including** a **local** **municipality** **located** **in** **a** **district** **or** **regional** **municipality** **or** **the** **County** **of** **Ontario**, having a **population** **of** **less** **than** **50,000**. Q. Reg. 71/04, s. 4.

5. (1) **Establishments** **not** **provided** **in** **subsection** **2** **(1)** **and** **(2)** **may** **be** **exempted** **for** **up** **to** **five** **holidays** **in** **a** **year** **during** **which** **a** **fair**, **feast**, **or** **other** **annual** **event** **is** **being** **held** **in** **that** **municipality**.

(2) **Subsection** **(1)** **does** **not** **apply** **in** **parades**. Q. Reg. 71/04, s. 5.

6. (1) **An** **application** **for** **an** **exemption** **under** **subsection** **4** **(3)** **of** **this** **Act** **shall** **contain** **the** **following**:

i. **A** **description** **of** **the** **area** **or** **the** **retail** **business** **establishment** **for** **which** **the** **exemption** **is** **sought**;

ii. **The** **exemption**, **in** **relation** **to** **the** **general** **public**, **if** **any**, **at** **any** **time**: **amount**, **for** **the** **time** **period** **during** **which** **the** **exemption** **is** **sought**;

iii. **Information** **establishing** **that** **the** **various** **criteria** **set** **out** **in** **this** **Regulation** **are** **met**.

(2) **An** **application** **in** **respect** **of** **a** **retail** **business** **establishment** **described** **in** **section** **1** **shall** **be** **made** **by** **that** **retail** **business** **establishment**. Q. Reg. 71/04, s. 6.
