#### 1 PERSONNEL MATTER

The Committee of the Whole (Closed Session) recommends that the confidential recommendation of the Committee of the Whole (Closed Session) be approved.

# 2 REQUEST TO REMOVE TWO MEMBERS AND REDUCE THE QUORUM OF THE MAPLE STREETSCAPE COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Committee of the Whole (Closed Session) recommends:

- 1) That Agostino Mancuso and Joseph Moriello be removed from the Maple Streetscape Community Advisory Committee as they have been absent for more than three consecutive regularly scheduled meetings;
- 2) That these two Members not be replaced and the membership be decreased from 14 to 12, reducing the quorum from 8 to 7; and
- 3) That the confidential report of the Maple Streetscape Community Advisory Committee, dated May 5, 2003, be received.

## 3 <u>REGIONAL FIRE DISPATCH</u>

  - c. Seeks a more detailed analysis and review of the business case to ensure that the financial aspects of the proposed centralized fire dispatch are acceptable;
  - d. Acknowledges the Region's commitment to fairly address the job security concerns of the affected employees, but also desires a comprehensive plan for resolution of the labour issues;
  - e. Has authorized the City Manager, Fire Chief and delegated staff, to participate in all aspects of the project, including the development of the governance model, service agreement, cost sharing formula and implementation plan; and
- 4. That, should the proposed Region-operated Central Fire Dispatch not proceed, the Fire Chief be authorized to explore other alternatives and report back to Council.

- 3. That the appropriate Staff attend the Ontario Municipal Board Prehearing to advise of the resolution of the appeals respecting the uses and their locations as they pertain to the Block 33 West lands regarding:
  - a. Section 3.3 (Part A) and Schedule "B" Land Use Designations;
  - b. Schedules "B", "I" and "J" Teston Road/Highway #400 Interchange/Street "A", and the undesignated lands at the northeast portion of the Block Plan; and
  - c. Section 10.2.iii Development Process/Block Plan for the lands designated "High Performance Employment Area" in OPA #600.
