Recommendation

The Director of Finance, in consultation with the Manager of Property Tax & Assessment recommends:

That the tax adjustments as outlined on the attached report be approved.

Economic Impact

The City's share of these property tax adjustments is approximately \$20,300. A provision for tax adjustments has been budgeted.

Purpose

To obtain Council's approval for the increase or cancellation of property taxes as permitted under the *Municipal Act, 2001*.

Background - Analysis and Options

Sections 357 and 358 – Cancellation, Reduction or Refunds:

Twenty-seven (27) applications have been prepared for Council's consideration for the cancellation, reduction or refund of taxes for the current and prior tax years, under sections 357 and 358 of the *Municipal Act, 2001, as amended*. There are various reasons for tax adjustments such as property becoming exempt, roll numbers being cancelled by the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC), buildings that have been demolished or razed by fire, and properties that have been over assessed by a gross or manifest clerical error. These tax adjustments do not relate to collection issues.

The total cancellation, reduction or refund of taxes, as recommended is \$85,589.28. The City portion of this amount is \$20,318.05, or approximately 24%. The tax adjustments relating to commercial and industrial properties are prior to any recalculations resulting from the capping legislation.

Section 359 – Increase of Taxes:

One (1) application has been prepared under section 359, *Municipal Act, 2001, as amended*, for Council's consideration. The increase in tax on the application is the result of the property being undervalued. Reasons for this can include gross or manifest errors that are clerical or factual, including transposition of figures, topographical, but cannot be an error in judgement in assessing the land. The total additional tax as recommended is \$5,986.50. This City portion of this amount is \$653.73.

Notice to Property Owners:

As required by the Act, notification of this meeting has been sent to all applicants and persons in respect of whom the applications were made, at least 14 days prior to the meeting.

Relationship to Vaughan Vision 2007

This report is consistent with the priorities previously set by Council and the necessary resources have been allocated and approved.

Conclusion

Council approval of the recommendations in this report will allow staff to proceed with the property tax adjustments.

Purpose

Background - Analysis and Options

Section 356 – Division Into Parcels:

One application has been received to sever property that was returned on the roll as one parcel. The Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) provides the City with a report outlining the value of each separate piece, and the taxes levied on the single piece are apportioned to the various parts in accordance with the assessment.

An apportionment does not result in a reduction or increase of taxes; it simply shares the taxes levied, among the parcels. Should any property owner disagree with the recommendation approved by Council, they can appeal the decision to the Assessment Review Board (ARB) for a further hearing.

Notice to Property Owners:

As required by the Act, notification of this meeting has been sent to all applicants and persons in respect of who the applications were made at least 14 days prior to the meeting.

Relationship to Vaughan Vision 2007

This report is consistent with the priorities previously set by Council and the necessary resources have been allocated and approved.

Conclusion

Council approval of the recommendations in this report will allow staff to notify the property owners of their proportionate share, and their right to appeal the decision to the ARB. If no appeals are filed with the ARB, staff will proceed with the property tax apportionments.

Background - Analysis and Options

The ward councillor's office has received a multitude of enquiries from individuals residing east and west of Kipling Avenue, south of Highway 7. The topic of these enquiries range from the completion of the Kipling parkette and local traffic, to issues relating to the development of the Calabro-Canadian Centre, on property leased to the City of Vaughan by the Province of Ontario and subsequently sub-leased to the Minime Sisters of the Passion, and sub-leased by them to the Calabro-Canadian Federation.

In the interests of providing the most up-to-date and accurate information to residents in respect to these and any related engineering, planning and park issues. Councillor Carella has discussed with some residents the holding of community meeting in the neighbourhood. The Ciocar Club has already agreed to offer space for such a meeting, and an invitation has been issued to a representative of the Federation, to ensure such representation at any meeting.

That Council of the City of Vaughan directs the Clerk to submit Vaughan Council's support for the Private Members Bill 75 – Homestead Act, 2006 introduced by MPP Tim Hudak. The Bill provides that:

- 1) The first \$25,000 in repairs, alterations, improvements or additions that an owner of residential land has made will not be considered to increase the current value of the land for assessment purposes if the municipality in which the land is located or the Assessment Review Board does not disallow, in the assessment roll, the value of the work done;
- 2) The Bill also imposes a cap of 5 per cent on the increase that can occur in the assessment of residential land if the owner of the land is the same as the owner of the land in the immediately preceding taxation year or is a child or spouse of that owner;
- 3) The assessment of a principal residence is reduced by an amount up to \$10,000 for the number of months of a taxation year during which the owner is at least 65 years of age or is disabled;
- 4) The Municipal Property Assessment Corporation is required to maintain a record of the assessment of land based on its current value and to provide a copy of the record to land owners within 24 hours at no charge upon request; and

That this be circulated to local MPP's and the Province of Ontario.
