Recommendation

The Commissioner of Finance & City Treasurer and the Director of Financial Services, in consultation with the Manager of Property Tax and Assessment recommends:

That the tax adjustments as outlined on the attached report be approved in accordance with the requirements under the Municipal Act.

Economic Impact

There is no economic impact to the City of Vaughan.

Communications Plan

As required by the Act, notification of this meeting has been sent to all applicants and persons in respect of whom the applications were made, at least 14 days prior to the meeting. Notices of Decisions will be issued to all applicants after the meeting of Council and these will detail the total amount of the adjustment and the right of the applicant to appeal the decision to the Assessment Review Board.

Purpose

To obtain Council approval for the apportionment of property taxes as permitted under the *Municipal Act*, 2001.

Background - Analysis and Options

Section 356 – Division Into Parcels:

Sixty-nine (69) applications have been received to sever property that was returned on the roll as one parcel. The Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) provides the City with a report outlining the value of each separate piece, and the taxes levied on the single piece are apportioned to the various parts in accordance with the assessment.

An apportionment does not result in a reduction or increase of taxes; it simply shares the taxes levied among the new parcels based on the apportioned value of assessment. Should any property owner disagree with the recommendation approved by Council, they can appeal the decision to the Assessment Review Board (ARB) for a further hearing.

Relationship to Vaughan Vision 2020

This report is consistent with the priorities previously set by Council and the necessary resources have been allocated and approved.

Regional Implications

There are no Regional Implications in this Report.

Conclusion

Council approval of the recommendations in this report will allow staff to bill the separate property owners their proportionate share, and confirm their right to appeal the decision to the ARB. If no appeals are filed with the ARB, staff will proceed with the property tax apportionments.

Purpose

The purpose of this report is to submit for Council's approval an amendment to the annual Schedule of Meetings to accommodate consideration of items that cannot be prepared in time for the circulation of the agenda for the June 5, 2012 Committee of the Whole meeting.

Background - Analysis and Options

Under the 2012 Schedule of Meetings adopted by Council on September 27, 2011, the last Committee of the Whole meeting in June is scheduled for June 5, 2012, at 11:00 a.m. Council meets on June 26, 2012.

City staff are working on a number of initiatives that may not be able to meet the reporting deadline for the June 5th meeting, the main agenda deadline for which is May 24th at noon. The agenda deadline for a meeting to be held on June 19th would be June 7, 2012. The recommendations of the Committee will be presented to Council at its June 26th meeting.

By amending the Schedule of Meetings to add an additional meeting, rather than calling a special committee meeting, the normal committee deadline and posting timelines apply. This approach is respectful of all participants in that it provides ample notice of the meeting, and results in the production of a meeting agenda posted on the City's web site one full week prior to the meeting. Amending the calendar minimizes the submission of addendum items, and avoids the lack of flexibility (and often short notice) inherent in the calling of special meetings of a committee. If the meeting is not required, it can be cancelled.

Relationship to 2020

This report is consistent with the priorities previously set by Council, particularly: "Ensure a High Performing Organization"

Regional Implications

The proposed meeting date does not conflict with Regional Council dates.

Conclusion

Amending the Schedule of Meetings at this time provides a flexible solution allowing for the submission of necessary items to Committee prior to the summer hiatus.
